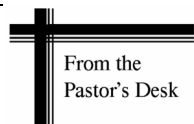

I have several topics for this weekend's bulletin none of which I can link in some type of order. We'll just jump right in and talk about them in any order beginning with the Youth

Group's 30 Hour Famine. This Friday and Saturday, more than thirty young people participated in the event. They began the fast steeped in the spirit of Lord walking the Stations of the Cross and celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation. They slept over night in the parish hall and on Saturday they had a guest priest come to address them. Later, they went to Palace View apartments to pray with the seniors and serve them lunch, returning for the 4 o'clock Mass. Then they broke their fast with dinner downstairs. At the 4 o'clock Mass some of the teens gave testimony after Communion to describe their experience with the fast. We can be justifiably proud of these young people, proud of their moral conscience and their resolve to make a difference through personal commitment and sacrifice. I commend them and Mrs. Mary Ellen Barlow-Hansen, their adult advisor, for all they have done. I thank all of our parishioners who have supported the teens in their drive to alleviate world hunger by making gifts and pledges and purchasing baked goods at their bake-off and bake sales.

On Monday we learned of some disturbing news. Fr. Jonas DeMoraes died in an automobile accident in Brazil on Sunday. Many of us remember Fr. Jonas who preceded Msgr. Pedro as priest to the Brazilian community here at St. Peter's. Msgr. Pedro is in Brazil and was with Fr. Jonas on Sunday. He called to tell members of the community here of Fr. Jonas's death. Frs. Jonas and Pedro had been together for the celebration of Mass on Sunday. After the Mass, Fr. Jonas and a deacon got into one car, Msgr. Pedro another. I don't know the details, but the car in which Fr. Jonas was riding was struck and he died at the scene. The deacon who was driving was hospitalized in serious condition. We are praying for Fr. Jonas' soul at Mass this weekend. We are offering Mass for him on the first available Sunday Mass. That will be the 7:30 Mass on May 4. When Msgr. Pedro returns, I'll ask him if the Brazilian community intends to hold a memorial. I'll let you know what he tells me.

There is to be a Eucharistic Congress in Quebec this June. I don't remember how often Eucharistic Congresses are held. This is the forty-ninth. They are international gatherings in which Catholics from around the world gather go bear witness to the Gospel by sharing prayer, reflection and fraternity. It was Pope John Paul II who chose Quebec as the site four years ago. The theme for this congress is "The Eucharist, Gift of God for the Life of the World." Bishop Lori has asked parishes to begin raising awareness of the Congress and to announce that he is inviting the faithful of the diocese to join him on a Eucharistic Family Vacation and Congress from June 14-23. He has sent the parishes posters which you can view in the vestibule. Individuals or families can, of course, make their own arrangements to attend the Congress, but the diocese is offering a "package deal." You can learn more about it from brochures on the table in the vestibule as well as by going to the diocesan website [www.bridgeportdiocese.com](http://www.bridgeportdiocese.com).

Monday evening we are holding our Lenten penance service. We are beginning at 7 p.m. It will follow the same format as in Advent. We are making it short and simple—an opening prayer, reading from scripture, short meditation and the individual confessions. As we always do, we encourage you to take advantage of this evening to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is a good thing to do. Our God is a God of healing, and He wants to extend that healing to us. Certainly our Gospel readings this Lent from Cycle A very strongly sent this message—the woman at the well is made new from her experience with the Lord, the man born blind is healed, and Lazarus is

resuscitated by our God who is concerned about his people and compassionate. Our psalm verse this weekend is: "With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption." I am writing this column Thursday afternoon after having proclaimed today's Gospel from St. John's fifth chapter in which we heard our Lord say, "Do not imagine that I will be your accuser before the Father." The Gospel was paired with a reading from the Book of Exodus in which Moses intercedes for the people after they have fashioned and worshipped a calf. Because Moses pleaded on behalf of the people, he was seen throughout Israel's history as the people's advocate before God. That is, of course, how we are meant to see Jesus. Is it Jesus who accuses us of sin, disobedience? No. We accuse ourselves. Our behaviors and disobedience are our accusers. Jesus underwent his Passion and death so he could intercede for us and bring us salvation. Our God is not a God of condemnation but a God whose whole being is about life. He invites us to be restored by his merciful love. Experience that merciful love within the prayerful context of the penitential service.

Next weekend is Palm Sunday. At our staff meeting this week we worked out many of the details of Holy Week. One of those details was a Palm Sunday procession at the 10:30 Mass. Weather permitting, for those who are interested in participating in the procession of palms, we will gather on the lawn next to the church. Palms will be blessed, the Gospel of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem read, and then we will process into church with our palm branches and take our places. Rather than enter church when you arrive for the 10:30 Mass, come around to the side and stand around the table with palm branches. At all other Masses we will celebrate "the solemn entrance" with the blessing and Gospel taking place at the doors of the church. We will make note of the rest of the many Holy Week events in next week's bulletin.

While there is still room on the page, I want to mention the progress we are making on our spring fund raiser—the tag sale. Our parish life committee has met and is working vigorously on this endeavor. They have come up with a catchy name—The Clean Sweep Tag Sale—and the date—June 14. A corn broom is going to be our symbol for this important event to take place in our parking lot. It is no secret to you that we need to raise funds *outside* of the regular offertory even though our offertory has been very good. We are in a much better position today than we were in July when we had only \$28,000 in the bank. Still, we all acknowledge that we need to have a cushion for bad times and a reserve for capital expenditures. The fact is that we never know when something big and costly may need to be done to one of our buildings. That's the reasoning behind the tag sale. Tag sales are fun and can generate a good deal of revenue that doesn't come out of *our* wallets. Once again, this is how the Clean Sweep Tag Sale will work. We will sell space for people like ourselves, friends, neighbors, strangers, to sell their own things and pocket the cash. We will also have a section for the parish itself to sell things. We can have a very successful tag sale if we tell our friends and neighbors about it and encourage them to be a part of a big sale that will attract a lot of people. Perhaps we want to go in on a table with friends. Second we can donate items directly to the parish. We are not ready to accept anything yet, but we need you to be keeping the tag sale in the back of your mind every time you see something lying about the house and wonder if you still need it. Put it aside for the Clean Sweep. Third, we can volunteer to help. Next month the committee will put more specific

information in the bulletin. My desire here is to keep you thinking about it.

Lastly, after a lengthy absence due to serious infection and considerable discomfort in the eye he injured in the fall, Deacon John is able to return to us. He was just able to return to work this week. John is not "out of the woods" yet. He will have to have another operation—his third—on the eye in the coming months. We are glad to have him back. Remember to request that he receives complete healing in your prayers.
