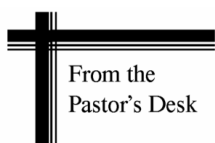

I've been low-key about my approach to the Annual Bishop's Appeal. Other than the paragraph that appeared here two weeks ago, I have not said much. Well, today you are hearing much more about the Appeal because we have chosen this week as *Living Our Faith Weekend*. The Diocese asks the pastors to select a weekend to speak directly to the congregation about the Appeal and to request that those in attendance who have not received Appeal materials at home or have misplaced them to take and complete an Appeal envelope today. I will also be asking those of you who have your letter at home and have not acted on it to do so now. Here are the latest facts and figures: 227 parishioners, 11.53% of us, have thus far participated in the Appeal pledging a total of \$66,710 toward our goal of \$110,000. The average gift is \$294.00. We're up from where we were two weeks ago. At that time I reported to you that 190 of us had responded, 9% of our parishioners, for a total of \$60,145. Last year the parish did not meet its goal. 14.9% of us participated then. We are inching our way up, and I sincerely thank the 37 families who have propelled us forward by making a pledge these last two weeks. We still have quite a way to go, and go we must. What we don't raise from pledges we are obligated to make up from our offertory income. I believe we can do this if we unite behind it and do our part. And so, I implore many, many more of you who have been sitting on the sidelines to jump in with a pledge. We are among the 34 of the 87 parishes that right now has a participation rate below 15%. I should think we can not only match last year's percentage but exceed it. *Please be part of the effort*. Let us unite to contribute to the good works of the Church. Let us have pride in who we are as a parish and accomplish it.

Let's shift from the temporal to the spiritual. It is the month of May. Without a doubt, May is the most beautiful month of the year, and so it has long been the time of year when the Blessed Virgin Mary has been honored. The beauty of the natural world reminds us of the intrinsic beauty of Mary's life, her faithfulness to the Covenant, joy in God her Father, and dedication to Christ her Son as his first disciple. To mark this month we are this Monday holding a Marian evening hour of prayer. We will recite the Rosary and Litany to the Blessed Mother and sing the traditional Marian hymns. In addition, as is the custom of the parish, we will pray the Rosary before the 12:10 Mass every day this month.

The next two weekends our parish celebrates First Communion. You noticed on your way into church this week that two large banners hang on either side of the door to the main aisle. On the banners are the pictures and names of our First Communicants. We ask you to remember these youngsters in your prayers this weekend. Pray that this first encounter with the Lord in the Eucharist will be the beginning of a long and intimate relationship with our Savior, that they will cherish the gift of Eucharist and always seek to receive Jesus in the Sacrifice of the Mass. We are having two ceremonies. Next weekend our First Communion will be celebrated in English. The following weekend we are having the ceremony in Spanish for the benefit of families who are not familiar with and cannot participate in the Liturgy in English.

## SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

On the topic of the spiritual, I want to introduce to you a parishioner, Yvette Lessard. Yvette came in to meet me some weeks ago. Yvette formally lived and worked in the Diocese of Lafayette, Louisiana before moving here. She is a trained spiritual director who has been engaged in spiritual direction and retreat work for over fifteen years. She has a strong theological and scriptural background. She has been a Director of Religious Education, a Pastoral Minister, teacher and Principal and has presented programs in adult spirituality and given workshops and conferences on various church topics. I think we are fortunate to have Yvette as part of our parish family. Yvette and I tossed around some thoughts of how she could place her talents at the benefit of the parish. We decided we would start with two offerings. One is spiritual direction, the other is a morning of prayer and reflection. I would like to say more about both, but space is tight in this weekend's bulletin. Therefore, I will return to Yvette next week and to these two offerings that may be a valuable vehicle for those of us who would like to become more aware of God's voice in our lives and deepen our response to it.

This weekend our Community Concerns Committee is holding its bake sale for the benefit of the Hanahoe Children's Clinic. I don't think any one here needs introduction to the Clinic or to its founder, Dr. Ann Hines, our parishioner, but just in case, let me mention the extraordinary work this dedicated, faith-filled physician has been carrying on in our city. Ann has been treating children whose families do not have health insurance for over 25 years. One can only imagine the number of children who have been able to live healthier lives because of the care Ann has given them and the relief she has provided to anxious parents lacking the means to go to a doctor's office. In past years the Committee went to a no-bake sale, but this year we thought it would be nice to return to the old-fashioned bake sale concept. If you are shying away from the sweets and calories, you can still support the Clinic with a donation as you leave church today.

Lastly, the TAG SALE. It is our intention to inundate you with the Clean Sweep Tag Sale so that no one can say they didn't know about it. Beginning this weekend we are adding pulpit announcements to our publicity campaign. I want to thank two of our parish council members, Dr. Paulette Pepin, and Dr. Marita Repole who volunteered to chair the Clean Sweep Committee. (No one answered my appeal in the bulletin so they were good enough to say they would do it at the last parish council meeting.) They will become the principal spoke persons for the event. Depending on which Mass you attend this weekend you will hear from one of them, another volunteer or me explain how you can be involved to make this a major fund raiser for the parish.

**Pope Benedict's visit**---*I was delighted to hear that I had been chosen to receive a ticket to the Papal Mass at Yankee Stadium and anticipated the event with excitement and wonder. What could one expect from being present at a Mass said by the Pope? I was worried that maybe my excitement would lead to disappointment and it would be like attending a regular Mass as is said every day.*

*I am sure that many of you watched the events preceding the arrival of the Pope and then the Mass being said by the Pope as*

*well, I do not need to tell you of its beauty and what an impression Catholic ritual can impart.*

*Rather, I would like to share my thoughts and observations. As Pope Benedict arrived at the stadium it struck me that it was a welcome fit for a king. His reaction to the crowd was one of complete humility and love. He wasn't the least a recipient of all the fanfare but rather a man happy to be there and feeling affection and love for those who had come out to see him. He was devoid of any feelings of his own grandeur but rather made me feel that he came to see us. That kind of selflessness is true humility and humbles those who observe it. He was the shepherd and he loved his flock.*

*The simplicity of the Mass is true beauty. It was striking that day. The prayers, the readings, all lead up to the consecration which is the simplest yet most magnificent act one can think of. My thoughts that this Mass might be like any other shamed me. That day it struck me how I can take a Mass for granted.*

*The responses by those in attendance that day during the Mass were thunderous. I am not sure you could sense that from the TV coverage. Usually one can hear their own voice when responding but that day my voice was drowned out by the crowd. I was reminded that we are the Body of Christ, a concept that I have to remind myself of sometimes. I felt the power for good that we can be when we act as one with Him. The way the Pope conducted himself was an example for me as to how all Catholics should conduct themselves – with humility and love and hope.*

*I feel truly blessed to have been present that day. Faith, hope and love to all from the Pope!*

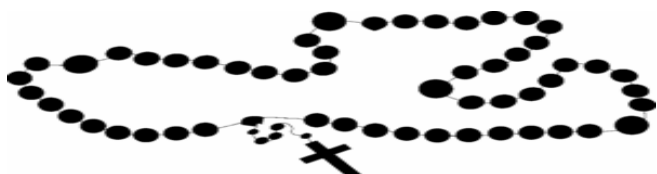
