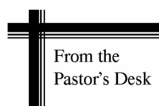

It is Ascension Thursday as I write this column. It is gorgeous outside. The sky is absolutely clear blue. One imagines it was a day like today when Jesus ascended in a cloud from the Mount of Olives. From the sounds of it, we are going to have a beautiful Memorial Day weekend weather wise. I hope those of you who have it off are enjoying the three day weekend!

Jesus' Ascension is, as St. Augustine called it, one of the "solemn anniversaries" of the Lord along with his Passion, Resurrection and the descent of the Holy Spirit. It seems, though, that the Ascension was not celebrated as a separate festival in the liturgy of the church during the first three centuries, but was included in the Feast of Pentecost. It is first mentioned as a separate feast by Eusebius, the Bishop of Nicomedia (341). By the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> century it was universally celebrated in the whole Roman Empire. The fact that the great Eastern Fathers, St. Gregory of Nyssa and St. John Chrysostom, wrote sermons for the Ascension indicates that at the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> century the feast was well established in the Eastern Church as well. As with other feasts of the Lord, the early Church celebrated not so much the memory of the historical event of Jesus' ascension, but its theological significance. St. John Chrysostom expressed it in these words: "Through the mystery of the Ascension we, who seemed unworthy of God's earth, are taken up into Heaven. . . Our very nature, against which Cherubim guarded the gates of Paradise, is enthroned today high above all Cherubim." A similar thought is expressed in the words of the Preface for the Feast: "Christ. . . has passed beyond our sight, not to abandon us but to be our hope. . . where he has gone, we hope to follow." Jesus visibly returned to the Father, underscoring his divine origin. The Ascension reveals our origin and the destiny which The Father and the Son offer to us. We, too, are God's daughters and sons, and our ultimate home is the glory of heaven.

The days between the Ascension and Pentecost are a preparation period for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The nine days between the two feasts is popularly called in some cultures the Pentecost Novena because of the words in the Acts of the Apostles. "So from the Mount of Olives they went back to Jerusalem. . . and when they reached the city they went to the upper room where they were staying. . . With one heart [they] joined constantly in prayer. . ." (1: 12-14) I have often thought about how little preparation we in the American Church make for the great feast of Pentecost. I decided we might conclude our Prayers of the Faithful this weekend and each daily Mass with the Prayer to the Holy Spirit. I have also asked that we sing a hymn invoking the Spirit this week as we anticipate Pentecost. Perhaps in our daily prayers during the week we might include the invocation to the Holy Spirit to come and rest with us, our families and friends, our parish and our world:

*Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created and you shall renew the face of the earth.*

*O God, who has instructed the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.*

Before I leave Pentecost, I might mention that during this period of nine days before Pentecost, the Brazilian Community is

celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation with some seventy-five parishioners on Friday evening. Auxiliary Bishop of Newark, New Jersey, Bishop Edgar Cunha, is coming to confer the Gifts of the Spirit. Bishop Cunha is a native of Brazil and will celebrate the Sacrament in Portuguese. Bishop Lori has generously allowed him to do so. We congratulate all who will be confirmed this week and pray that they, too, will become witnesses to the living God in our world.

Once again, outside my window as I write, cars are pulling in from time to time to donate items for the Clean Sweep Tag Sale. May I mention again here that our tag sale is this coming Saturday. We have high hopes that we can net a tidy sum which we can put towards our capital expenditures. It is not too late to reserve a table to sell items for yourself or to volunteer during the day or for the set-up on Friday. You can do either in the vestibule this weekend. All of us can continue to get the word out that we are having the sale. The additional banner on the rectory side seems to have been successful in getting people's attention. We're hoping, too, that with the sale on the rectory property, we might draw more people passing by in their cars.

We are making progress toward our Bishop's Appeal goal, but it is slow. I am anxious that our number of participating families remains rather low for a parish of our size. Two hundred sixty-two families have made a gift or pledge as of May 20. Only a handful of in-pew envelopes came in last weekend's offertory basket. We were at 255 participating families going into last weekend. I'm keeping envelopes in the pews until the close of the Appeal at the end of June with the hope that many of you who do not have pledge materials at home will find your way to take one and make a gift. Last year 431 parishioners participated in the Appeal. We desperately need that kind of involvement. One hundred sixty-one people who gave last year have not given this year. We need all of these 161 people and then some. For the sake of comparison, right now 424 families at the parish on the other side of the tracks have made a gift to the Appeal. How I dislike that our participation rate is trailing theirs. We may not reach our goal of \$110,000, but we could be very proud nonetheless to say that over a quarter of us banded together in fraternal affection, cooperation and charity. Let's do it!

Last week members of our Community Concerns Committee noted that we did not place anything in the bulletin about the monthly food collection. We forgot. So, while we are accepting food donations today, we are making the announcement this weekend and will accept them next weekend as well. You have read this time and time again, but let me repeat that the food is leaving the Daily Bread Pantry faster than it is arriving. Any help we can give is gratefully accepted. You might not know that we have a team of folks from the parish who volunteer at the pantry. We are grateful to them for being the collective face of our parish's love and mercy to the poor.

Speaking of our goodness toward others, I thank everyone who contributed to the Spare Change collection last weekend. \$462 was donated toward our Good Samaritan fund to assist fellow parishioners in their need. While that won't go a long way, it is a start, and we are talking about putting aside a percentage from fundraising events to support this endeavor.

On Monday, Memorial Day, our one Mass at 8:00 a.m. is offered for the men and women of our country who, in the course of our history, have sacrificed their lives. We honor and pray for them as well as our men and women currently serving in the

military. We pray, too, for peace so that no more young lives are taken by war.

Once again, enjoy the holiday. Summer is here!
